1	273	.5(a)(2)(b)	Identification. Procedures for intake screening to identify inmates who are known to be or observed to be mentally disabled and/or potentially suicidal and procedures for compliance with Code of Criminal Procedure Article 16.22 and referrals to available mental health officials.

While reviewing the mental health screening documentation, this inspector observed that the jail staff is not completing the mental health screening form in its entirety. This inspector could not verify that the jail is notifying the magistrate as required by Article 16.22 of the code of criminal procedures.

2	279	.1(1)(4)(5)	(1) A regular daily schedule for the work and inspections necessary to keep the facility clean; which schedule shall be assigned and supervised by corrections officers who have the responsibility for keeping the facility clean and making regular sanitation inspections (4) water tight garbage containers with tight fitting covers in the kitchen; (5) the maintenance of toilets, lavatories, showers, and other equipment throughout the facility in good working order;
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While conducting a walkthrough of the jail, this inspector observed the facility to be unclean in many areas. There were garbage containers without lids in the kitchen and multiple issues throughout the jail in regards to the maintenance of toilets, lavatories, showers and other equipment.

3	279	.1(2)	Water and sewage systems not part of a public system and food preparation areas shall be inspected at least annually by health authorities and record kept for each inspection;
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While reviewing the health inspection documentation, it was determined that a health inspection of the kitchen has not been conducted since June 13, 2017.
