1	429	.3	<p>Safety Inspections: (a) Only an individual certified by the commission as a fire inspector may conduct a fire safety inspection required by a state or local law, rule, regulation, or ordinance.</p> <p>It was determined that the fire marshal is not certified in accordance with Texas Commission on Fire Protection as a fire inspector per Government Code 419.909 and TAC 429.3</p>
2	273	.5(a)(1)	<p><u>Training</u>: Provisions for staff training (<u>including frequency and duration</u>) on the procedures for recognition, supervision, documentation, and handling of inmates who are mentally disabled and/or potentially suicidal. Supplemental training should be provided to those staff members responsible for intake screening;</p> <p>During the review of suicide prevention training, it was determined staff had not been trained annually during calendar year 2021 as required by the Fisher County Mental Disabilities/Suicide Prevention Operational Plan. This was noted as a deficiency during the FY19 annual inspection.</p>
3	273	.5(c)(2)	<p>Maintain documentation to be available at the time of inspection showing that information for each inmate designated was submitted for CCQ/IDD checks, to include notification to the magistrate and the Local Mental Health Authority or Local Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Authority as per CCP 16.22</p> <p>It was determined on two occasions the magistrate was not notified when warranted by answers provided to the questions on the screening form for Suicide and Medical/Mental/Developmental Impairments. This was noted as a deficiency during the FY19 annual inspection.</p>
