



1	259	.138(a)	<p>One or more holding cells should be provided to hold inmates pending booking, court appearance, identification, housing assignment, discharge, or other reasons for temporary housing. Inmates shall not be held more than 48 hours and the cell shall include the following features.</p> <p>On the date of inspection, it was determined that three (3) inmates were held in holding cells for more than 48 hours.</p>
2	273	.5(a)(1)	<p>Training. Provisions for staff training (including frequency and duration) on the procedures for recognition, supervision, documentation and handling of inmates who are mentally disabled and/or potentially suicidal. Supplemental training should be provided to those staff members responsible for intake screening.</p> <p>Interviews revealed that jail staff had not received Suicide Prevention Training in the last 12 months in accordance with the approved Mental Disabilities/Suicide Prevention Operational Plan.</p>
3	273	.2(7)	<p>Provide procedures for the distribution of prescriptions in accordance with written instructions from a physician by an appropriate person designated by the sheriff/operator.</p> <p>Review of Medication Administration Records (MARs) failed to show that medications are distributed in accordance with written instructions from a physician.</p>
4	283	(3)	<p>Provide maximum time limits not to exceed 60 days with interim response not to exceed 15 days for written replies by the grievance board.</p> <p>On the date of inspection, it was determined that inmates are not receiving written interim responses within 15 days or a written final response within 60 days to their grievances in accordance with minimum jail standards.</p>
